About Making a Will

Making a will is simple and straightforward and ensures that your wishes are carried out after you pass away. A legacy gift is a charitable donation left in your will. It is important to take professional advice from a solicitor to ensure that your intentions are expressed in the correct legal terms.

Understanding Legacy Terms

A **Legacy Gift** can be a specific cash sum or items of values such as paintings or artefacts.

A **Residual Bequest** is a percentage of your estate and is least affected by inflation.

A **Reversionary Bequest** means that the percentage of your estate will only pass to your chosen charity after the death of a spouse or relative, protecting the needs of your loved ones.

Codicil is the addition of legacy gifts to an existing will.

What are the tax benefits?

By giving 10% or more of your net estate to charity you may reduce the rate of Inheritance Tax for your heirs.
