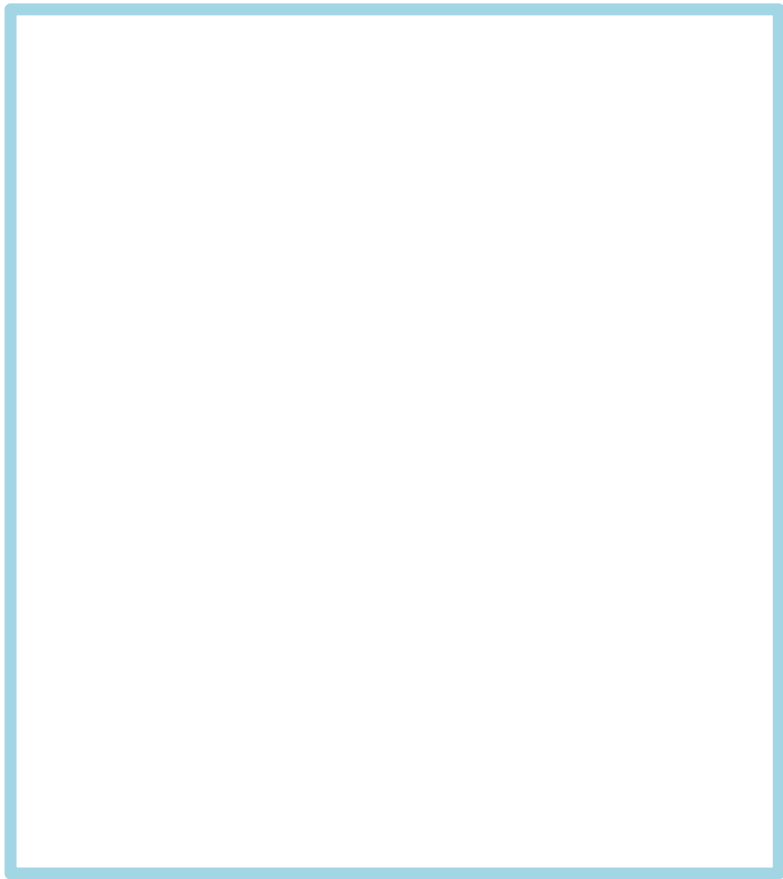

Redesign the outfit you are wearing today or the one of someone else you are with.



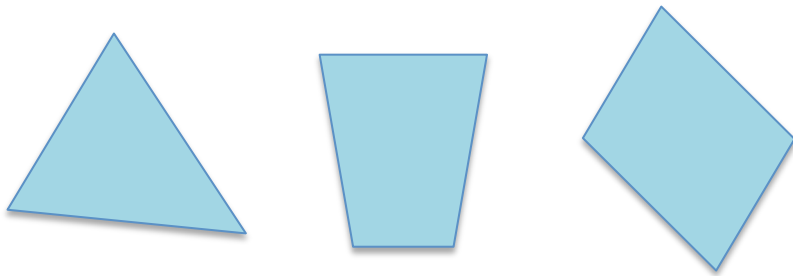
Sandra Blow loved collage and would often stick different materials onto the surface of her paintings. Wrote a list of how many different materials can you spot in her work.

Sophia Starling, Kate Terry & Sarah Kate Wilson

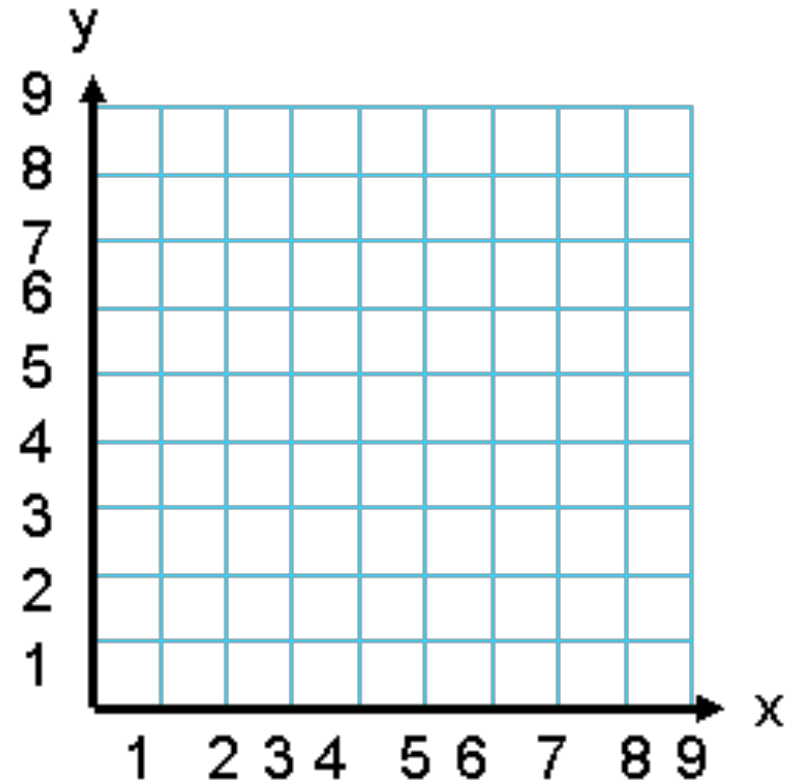
Can you name these three geometric shapes?

Using the grid below can you work out how to draw a similar pattern found in *Series 1 no 7*?



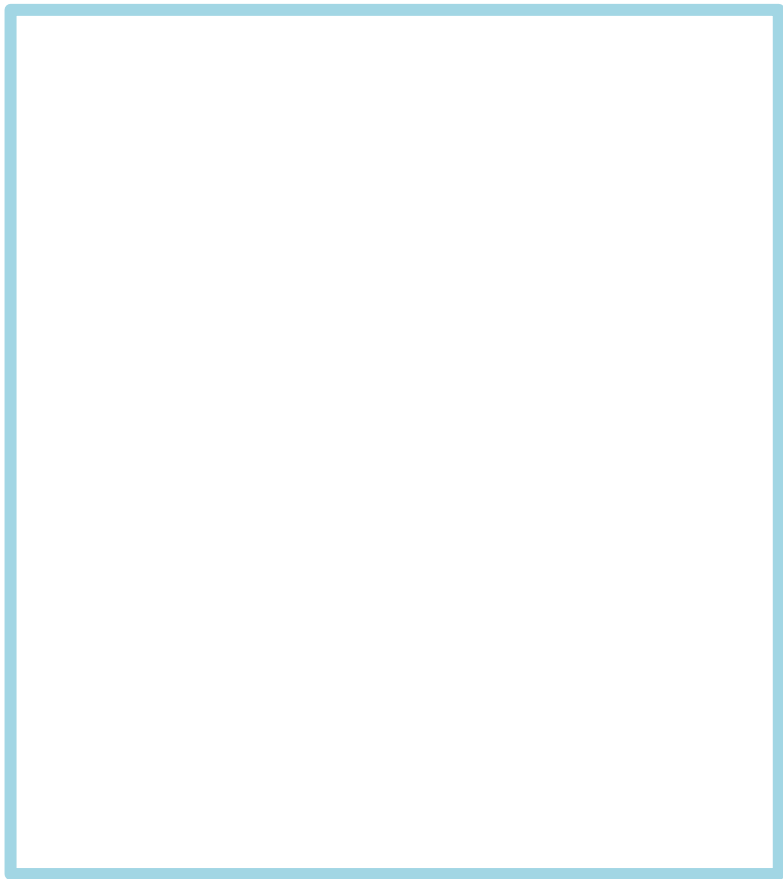
Look into Sarah Kate Wilson's *Alien - 3* where is the best spot to stand to ensure the greatest number of you is looking back?

A ziggurat is a form made from a stacked shape that gets smaller in size as it grows taller. Can you draw an example of this form in every day life?

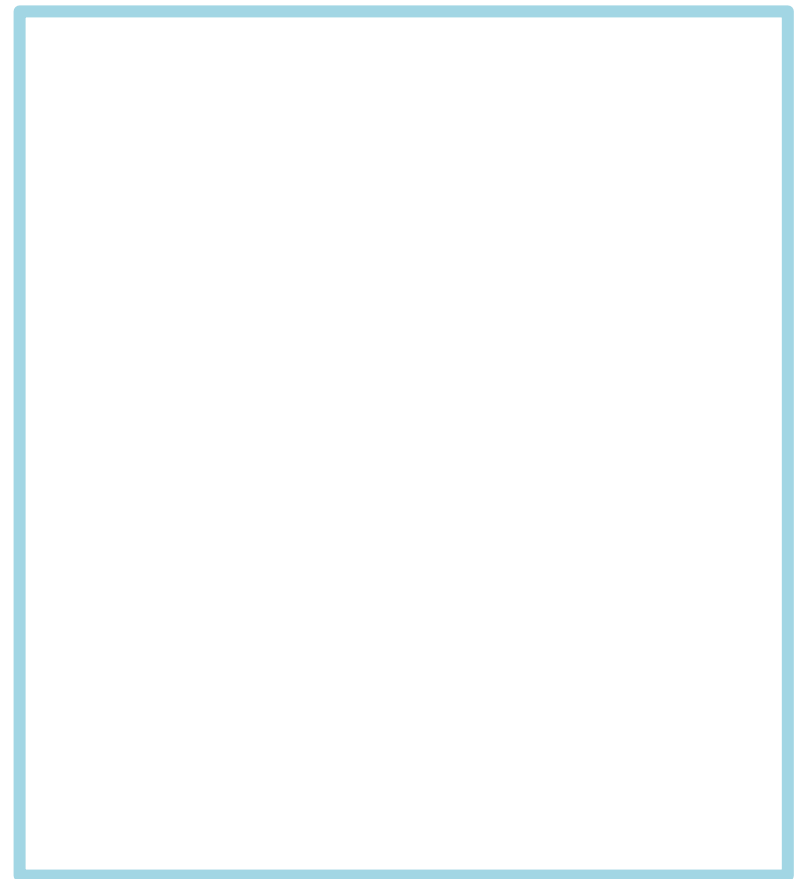


Looking at all of the works in the upper gallery, which colour repeats most often?

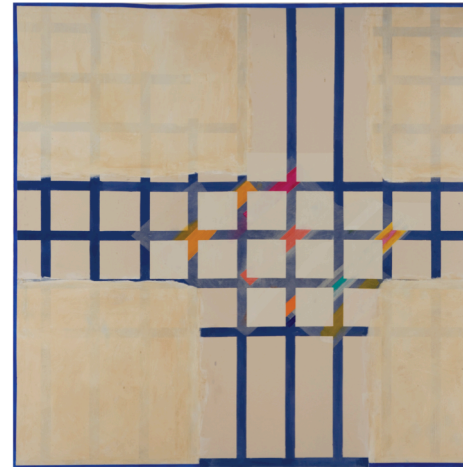
