A Reversionary Bequest

means that the percentage of your estate will only pass to your chosen charity after the death of a spouse or relative, protecting the needs of your loved ones.

Codicil is the addition of legacy gifts to an existing will.

What are the tax benefits?

By giving 10% or more of your net estate to charity you may reduce the rate of Inheritance Tax for your heirs.
