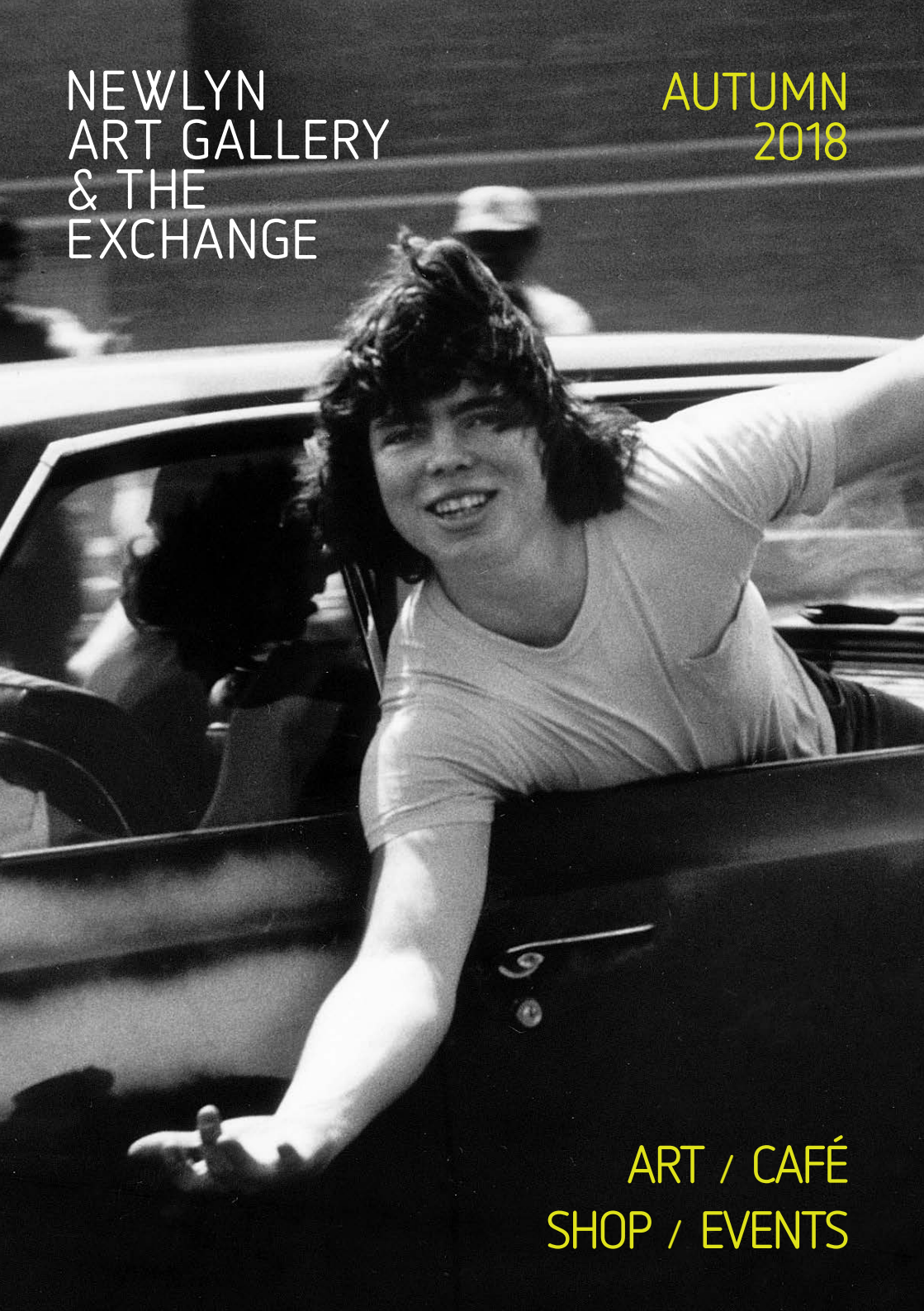


WINTER CLOSURE DATES

MANY & BEAUTIFUL THINGS

29 SEP – 5 JAN

Showing across both venues, *Many & Beautiful Things* is concerned with that time in youth when anything is possible, everything is ahead of you, and life is a rush for new experiences.

Of course, there may be inner anguishes, but still there’s an abandon, a thirst – before it inevitably leaves, usually gradually, sometimes suddenly. *Many & Beautiful Things* is as much about those points when things change, as it is about a mind-set that it won’t.

The group exhibition features photography and moving image work by internationally recognised artists, including Dutch photographer Rineke Dijkstra, whose portraits are of a young soldier’s transition from boy to man over three years as he trained for the Foreign Legion. London-based Melanie Manchot filmed her daughter for one minute each month from the age of 11 to 18. The installation presents her changing relationship to the camera and to the world.

Other works include Binelde Hyrcan’s film of four boys on an Angolan beach who strive for the good life; Santiago Mostyn’s photo/ text work *All Most Heaven*, an intimate and intense celebration of nomadic journeys across America, and Joseph Szabo’s photographs of high school students in the 1970s and ‘80s.

Curated by Blair Todd, *Many & Beautiful Things* also includes Catie Close, Naomi Frears, Lulu Freeman & Nadja Redman, Housework Press, James Loraine-Smith, Callum Mitchell, Lucy Willow and Young People Cornwall.

29 SEP – 5 JAN

Fragment24a, an exhibition within an exhibition, is a three-strand response to *Many & Beautiful Things* by The Collaborators, the gallery’s collective of emerging artists aged 30 and under. Running concurrent to the main show, there will be a mixed media exhibition of work in The Engine Room at The Exchange, reflecting their interests and concerns; two billboard prints of still images, one for a wall at Newlyn Art Gallery, and another at The Exchange, capturing the essence of what it’s like to be young; plus an Instagram takeover offering a different perspective during the exhibition. All three elements will explore the same themes as *Many & Beautiful Things* and be a record of what it is to be young now.

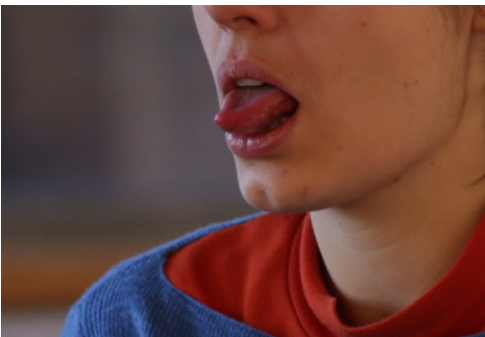
